Selected Speaker Biographies



David Horsager, Author, Speaker, Strategist

David Horsager, MA, CSP, is a business strategist, keynote speaker and author of the National Bestseller, *The Trust Edge*. His work has been featured in prominent publications such as *Fast Company, Forbes*, and *The Wall Street Journal*. David has worked to develop trusted leaders and organizations on six continents, with clients ranging everywhere from Wells Fargo and the New York Yankees to Goodyear and the Department of Homeland Security. David has enjoyed serving in a number of leadership roles, from ethics commissioner to executive producer to director on a variety of boards. David's new book, *The Daily Edge: Simple Strategies to Increase Efficiency and Make an Impact Every Day* is his newest release.



Grant Golliher, Horse Whisperer

Grant Golliher was born in Palisade, Colorado and has spent his life working with horses. An early proponent of the Horse Whispering method of training, Grant travels around the world using the art of Horse Whispering to illustrate the keys to healthy, trusting relationships. Horse Whispering is based on the principles of developing a rapport with horses, using communication techniques derived from observation of free-roaming horses, and rejecting abusive training methods. During a typical demonstration, the transformation seen in the horse is nothing short of amazing and provides a framework to help individuals better understand their own challenges and triumphs. Grant and his wife Jane are third generation Jackson Hole ranchers and own Diamond Cross Ranch, a historical working ranch.
