ESS BUDGET

Background

The ESS Rules of Operation currently state "The Chair of ESCOP may authorize the expenditure of assessed funds up to \$5000 with 2/3 approval of the ESCOP Executive Committee" (page 5).

Situation

- ESS has one account at APLU for all deposits and expenditures
- The predominant assessment and expenditure is for the Communications and Marketing Committee (CMC) efforts
- Additional partners funding the CMC has resulted in a reserve
- The frequency and need for resources to support ESS has increased
- The existing ESS APLU account, with an Amendment, would provide a formal mechanism for routine support of ESS activities

ESS BUDGET

Recent Examples

- Office operations, travel and meetings, dues/memberships, bad debt
- NC-FAR Lunch and Learn seminar
- APLU Awards recognition and program
- National impact writing effort
- APLU/AAVMC Antibiotic Resistance Manager support
- ESS standing committee meetings

Proposal

- Amend the ESS Rules of Operation
- Create a budget development and approval process that is comprehensive, efficient, transparent and responsive to ESS members and ESS activities
- As a best practice, formally create a budget process with regular feedback mechanisms
- Per policy, a narrative was provided 30 days in advance of a vote

ESS BUDGET

Result of a Yes Vote

- Annual budget developed and voted upon at the ESS Annual Meeting
- "The Chair of ESCOP may authorize the expenditure of assessed funds up to \$5000 with a simple majority of the ESCOP Executive Committee. Expenditure of funds greater than \$5000 requires the approval of ESS by a direct vote during the year or as a vote during the ESS budget approval process".
- Amended into Article VII ASSESSMENTS AND BUDGETS.

Result of a No Vote

- Antiquated processes remain
- Missed opportunities to advance ESS
